EDUCATIONAL TRAINING VOUCHER (ETV)

You may be eligible to receive up to \$5,000 per year until your 23rd birthday. As long as you are enrolled in a post-secondary education institution and meet the enrollment criteria and satisfactory academic progress policies as established by the institution.

Who is Eligible for ETV?

To be eligible for the ETV Program you must:

- Be at least 16 and likely to remain in DFPS foster care until turning 18, or are in extended foster care.
- Have aged out of DFPS foster care and are not yet age 23.
- Have been adopted from DFPS foster care after turning age 16 and not yet age 23.
- Have entered the Permanency Care Assistance (PCA) program after turning age 16 and are not yet age 23.

Other Eligible Students include:

- Youth placed in the custody of the Texas Juvenile Justice Department or under the jurisdiction of a local juvenile probation department who were receiving Title IV-E foster care payments the day before turning age 18 and are not yet age 23.
- Tribal youth or young adults in tribal foster care who are not yet age 23.
